## Staffing Updates

- Mme. Zalucki is on General Leave for the 2025-2026 school year, a staffing update which occurred over the summer.
- Mme. Forster joins the CBE and Woodman with extensive background in Math and language acquisition. Mme. Forster is a native French/English speaker and is teaching French-as-a-Second language classes to students of the English program.
- Mme. Welton is a temporary teacher in Late French 7, while Mme. Massey is on maternity leave. In addition to French language pedagogy, Mme. Welton has a voice, piano and drama background.

### Student Enrollment Trends

• 545 students as of Sept. 23

- CBE projections indicated 522, because of no longer being an overflow school for Elboya and Rideau Park Schools
- Class sizes range from 21-32, dependent upon grade and program
- Woodman is fortunate to have received Equity Funding to support resourcing our three programs

## Observations of First Month of School

- Positive period of adaptation; many new students are observed to be making new peer connections and assimilating expectations for conduct and learning
- Intense launch of athletics with accompanying integration of new provincial legislation related to the Fairness and Safety in Sport, period of adaptation for staff and families
